ITEM 1: Update on Definition and Clarification of Terms

On May 29, a subcommittee consisting of AFAC and RFAC members met and developed "final" definitions of the terms Measure, Limiting Factor, and Threat, to be considered for adoption by the Members Advisory Group on June 19th. The definitions, including examples, were distributed to all AFAC members.

The AFAC will discuss any issues regarding the definitions.

ITEM 2: Update on AFAC Database of Populations, Objectives, and Limiting Factors

AFAC members have had the opportunity to populate the database since March 19, 2007.

The AFAC will review and discuss progress made in revising the population list, verifying objectives, and identifying limiting factors, and develop a timeline for completing this assignment prior to the next Amendment Strategy Workshop scheduled for July 24th and 25th in Spokane.

ITEM 3: Draft Amendment Template

The AFAC will review and discuss a potential template for developing Program Measures based on the completed database.

ITEM 4: Lamprey Technical Workgroup Review of U.S. Army Corps of Engineers 2007-2011 Pacific Lamprey Passage Plan

The Members Advisory Group directed the AFAC to provide comments on the USACE lamprey passage plan by June 19th. To that effect, the LTWG was asked to provide comments to the AFAC. The AFAC will review the comments and forward them to the MAG as appropriate.

ITEM 5: Other Updates and Schedule Next Meeting

The next AFAC meeting should occur prior to the Amendment Strategy Workshop scheduled for July 24th and 25th in Spokane.
