#### **ITEM 2: Progress on Translocation Review Paper Task**

A preliminary draft of the translocation review paper was distributed to the subgroup on August 10. Most previously assigned sections of the paper were included, but a few were missing or needed more detail. The draft paper to date includes most of the needed introductory material, and some of the information on current translocation programs. Work remaining includes providing more detail on the current programs, as well as sections covering risks/benefits, management alternatives, and conclusions.

Members of the subgroup should review the draft prior to the teleconference, and be prepared to discuss needed revisions, additions, improvements, etc. Members of the subgroup should also be prepared to discuss potential content of the remaining sections, as well as deciding who will prepare these drafts.
