Discussion: The eventual product has been partitioned into three "tiers": (1)

Identification and definition of potential lamprey passage metrics, (2) determination of which metrics are most relevant and measurable,

and (3) application of standards to chosen metrics.

Chris Caudill and Josh Murauskas volunteered to prepare a preliminary draft of Tier 1. Chris and Josh distributed a draft, and some comments were the submitted by members of the subgroup.

The subgroup discussed the draft and comments received. Most additions/changes were incorporated into the draft. Remaining tasks

include:

(1) Revision of the Introduction (most subgroup members agreed that

an Introduction is needed). The Introduction will include a

description of the three tiers. Remaining content will depend partially on comments received by Bob Heinith after he meets with tribal lamprey staff.

- (2) More detail provided for the table on juvenile passage metrics
- (3) Completion of a glossary
- (4) General cleanup of revisions

A glossary is important because the subgroup decided that most terms should be as "neutral" as possible (e.g., "ratio" instead of "efficiency") and may not be familiar to most readers.
