Judge Redden's Ruling – June, 10, 2005 – Judge Redden ruled for the plaintiffs for additional summer spill. He did not vacate or remand the BiOp. He asked the attorneys to work out some briefs on how the remand should be done and will rule on that at a later date. CBFWA Rolling Provincial Review Implementation Annual Report Volume II - The report was presented at the June 2005 NPCC Meeting and released to the region for review. Information presented in this report includes the accomplishments of projects that were reviewed during the Anadromous Fish Committee's 2004 conferences in the Tri-Cities and Portland as well as an update of BPA's fish and wildlife expenditures. Projects reviewed during the 2004 conferences, but not included in this report, will be updated and represented in Volume III. All-H Project for Biological Objectives – CBFWA staff will be organizing local workshops in selected subbasins to test run the All-H Analyzer tool. It is expected that the co-managers will discuss resident fish objectives at these workshops as well. CBFWA staff has created a web page on the CBFWA web site to track progress of the Council's development of the next Program amendment process (see http://www.cbfwa.org/fwprogram/amendment05).

Run Status and Harvest Issues: Pete Hassemer is giving updates on fish migration status and the importance of keeping the NPCC F&W Committee updated on harvest and run timing issues. The Council will sponsor a mini-workshop at their July meeting to discuss an IEAB report on the economic impacts of fishing and the ISAB harvest report. WDFW will provide the migration update presentations for summer Chinook starting in June through August.
