ITEM 3: Develop & Recommend a CBFWA Response to BPA's FY07-09 Actions

The Data Management Framework Subcommittee of CBFWA has been working on a data management framework for the CBFWA Amendment Strategy. The DMFS could develop interim recommendations for FY08-09.

ITEM 5: CSMEP Work Plan

 The CSMEP project was recommended for funding for FY07 & FY08 at the MSRT level of \$984,500 by the NPCC with a decision for FY 09 pending review of the project. BPA's action was to fund CSMEP for FY07 at the NPCC recommended level. But reduce funding to \$500,000 for FY08 and cease funding for FY09.

- A brief background of CSMEP will be presented including: history of the

 using CSMEP products, and expected future products and recommendations

ITEM 10: "All-H Analyzer" (AHA) Request

Discussion items:

• The "All-H Analyzer" has been the tool utilized to conduct the analysis needed to perform the hatchery review requested and funded by NOAA fisheries. The outcome of this analysis is an integration of strategies across the four H's and an expression of the biological objectives established by the fish and wildlife managers. This outcome can be used to substantiate strategies recommended by CBFWA as measures to the NPCC in the upcoming amendment process. The mechanism to do this would be the development and recommendation of a task for funding as part of the FY07-09 CBFWA project. The request would then have to be considered in the within-year budget modification process.

• Chip McConnaha, of Jones & Stokes has been invited to demonstrate the capabilities of the tool as it pertains to both anadromous and resident fish, and the capabilities that the tool now provides for "rolling" information up to higher geographic scales.

 The MAG will be asked to deliberate and make a recommendation as to the appropriateness of using this tool for linking the biological objectives and measures within the CBFWA amendment strategy.
