ITEM 2: Progress Reports from Technical Committees

Assignments to technical committees include:

- Define and clarify terms (focal species, objectives, how to express limiting factors); confirm population-level biological objectives; ensure that priorities affecting fish and wildlife are captured; validate current limiting factors including out-of-basin affects; review and build on strategies and actions necessary to reduce limiting factors (From Members, February 2007).
- Determine how to best define biological objectives as part of the amendment process: Define populations, environmental attributes, and metrics to be used; define the appropriate scale for metrics; consider the compatibility of Council's objectives with other activities such as recovery planning (From MAG; October 2006).

The Anadromous Fish Advisory Committee (AFAC), Resident Fish Advisory Committee (RFAC) and Wildlife Advisory Committee (WAC) will report on progress (1) defining terms, (2) confirming populations and population-level objectives, and (3) validating limiting factors (and threats). They will also present issues identified in each of their respective groups as they proceeded through their assignments.
