ITEM 5: Comments on NPCC High Level Indicators(HLI's) 11:00 a.m.

On March 13th, the Council initiated a request for comments on their updated list of HLI's (<u>Council Request for Comments: HLI's & Descriptions</u>). Although CBFWA submitted comments in July 2008 (<u>CBFWA Agencies & Tribes Letter to Council: HLI Comments July 2008</u>), the MAG determined that CBFWA could provide additional comments as a result of the Program being finalized. The

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MAG directed CBFWA staff to develop HLI comments to the Council for Members review and approval on April 1st for timely submission to the Council by the April 24th deadline.

On or about March 31st, the Council extended the deadline for comments to May 18th. Prior to learning of the extension, CBFWA staff prepared a draft comment letter for Members review and approval on April 1st: <u>Draft Letter from CBFWA to the Council RE: Comments on Council's HLI's</u>. However, as a result of the comment deadline extension, the HLI comments review was deferred and scheduled for full MAG review at this MAG meeting.

appears to be the only formal mechanism that CBFWA Members have to work with Randy Fisher, Executive Director of PSMFC and responsible party for those contracts.

Over the next year, implementation of an amended Program and the BiOp will
most likely prompt an extensive review of all the projects that reside at PSMFC.
On April 1st, the Members discussed inviting Randy Fisher to the May
teleconference and requested that CBFWA staff work with the MAG to frame a
conversation with PSMFC and Randy Fisher relative to the categorical review.
