- Northwest Power and Conservation Council (Council)Updates

The 6<sup>th</sup> Northwest Power Plan was adopted by the Council and is available online for review. Brian Lipscomb will provide an update regarding the Council's contemplation to establish a committee consisting of the Agencies and Tribes, the Customer Groups, and BPA relative to operational uncertainties of the system to allow for better projections for power from the hydro power system and power from other sources

The Council is expected to request public comment on the Monitoring, Evaluation, Research and Reporting (MERR) Plan at their March meeting. The MERR Plan aims to ensure that the Council's Fish and Wildlife Program goals, objectives, and actions are monitored, evaluated, and reported in a manner that allows assessment and reporting of Program progress. The CBFWA efforts to develop ongoing assessments are being constructed under the framework provided by the MERR.

The following are the changes to the CBFWA Charter that will be reviewed with the MAG:

- 1. Updated date of adoption in the title and on the header of each page;
- 2. The Coeur d'Alene Tribe has been deleted as a member, Section 401 (B);
- 3. The Upper Snake River Tribes (USRT) has been substituted for the Upper Columbia United Tribes (UCUT) as a Tribal Organization for the purposes of Section 404(B)(2) establishing a quorum, Section 404(D)(5) establishing a consensus position, and Section 502(D)(2) establishing a MAG quorum. Amendments for this purpose are in Sections 402(C), 404(B)(2), and 404(D)(5);
- 4. The Members Executive Committee (MEC) has been added to Sections 404(A)(2) and 501;
- 5. Clarifying language has been added to align the Charter with the procedural adjustments that were agreed to by the Members in adopting the 2010 Annual Work Plan. This amendment formalizes the month of the annual Members meeting with the Annual Work Plan content and development timing and clarifies BPA funding. Amendments are in Section 403(A), 404(F) and 505(B)(2);
- 6. Clarifying language has been added for rotation of officers. Amendments are in Section 403(A).
