ITEM 5: FY 2012 and Beyond Work Plan Development Issues and Schedule

Background:

At the March meeting in Boise, ID, the Members directed the MAG to begin to focus efforts on developing a FY 2012 and beyond work plan. CBFWA staff developed bullets that were briefly reviewed by the MAG at the April MAG meeting: *Assumptions and Considerations for Developing the FY12 and Beyond CBFWA Work Plan and* Budget (posted under April 19 MAG meeting). Several questions remained unanswered at that time.

After the April 20 meeting with BPA and the Council, CBFWA staff updated the draft briefing paper: <u>CBFWA FY2012 and Beyond Work Plan and Development</u>. Tom Iverson reviewed the updated briefing paper with the MAG to prompt discussion regarding the best course of action to develop the work plan and budget.

At the May MAG meeting, Chairman Taki directed CBFWA staff to email MAG members and call for volunteers to revitalize and populate the MAG subgroup. The subgroup was tasked with completing the assignment, as directed by the Members in the March 2011 meeting in Boise, i.e., to develop the draft CBFWA five year work plan and review the staffing levels to complete the work (see Item 9: Members March 20, 2011 Draft Action Notes).

MAG Subgroup Update

- The MAG subgroup met on June 21 and discussed the anticipated work for CBFWA in FY 12-14. The subgroup agreed that the <u>FY11 CBFWA work plan</u> would remain relatively unchanged during FY12 and FY13; however, beginning in FY14 there will be a shift in work from the technical committees to a greater emphasis on policy coordination.
- CBFWA staff was directed to write a three year work plan based off of FY11, with some expansion to include Columbia River Treaty updates and incorporating regional viewpoints into local planning and evaluation discussions (helping regional recovery boards understand the broader basinwide context of their efforts).
- The subgroup discussed potential funding scenarios to support the work. The greatest challenge for FY11 has been the elimination of the unallocated placeholder for the Members. Staff was directed to summarize the last three years obligations and expenditures for each Member for CBFWA participation funding. Using that as context, each Member will be asked to reserve funds closer to their actual historic expended amount, rather than their obligated amount. Staff will contact each MAG representative prior to the meeting and develop a draft budget for discussion to support the three year work plan.

Recommended Action:

Approve FY12 and beyond three year work plan and budget to be sent to the Members for their consideration at the August Members' meeting.
