BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUSINESS COUNCIL OF THE SHOSHONE PAIUTE TRIBES,

**CBFWA** 

WHEREAS, This organization is an Indian Organization known as the Shoshone Paiute Tribes of the Duck Valley Reservation defined under the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, as amended, to exercise certain rights of home rule and to be responsible for the promotion of cultural, economic and social welfare of its tribal members; and

WHEREAS, The Tribes have a unique interest in the fish, wildlife, and their habitats in the drainage basins of the Snake and the Columbia River and have made repeated efforts to document and proclaim the negative impacts caused by dams and other man made obstructions on the Columbia River and its tributaries; and

WHEREAS, The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) provides regional coordination funding for the Tribes to promote their sovereign interests in the Columbia River Basin through funding the Tribes' participation in the Columbia Basin Fish and Wildlife Authority (CBFWA);

WHEREAS, The Tribes have determined that CBFWA no longer meets the regional coordination needs of the Tribes; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Council hereby formally withdraws the Shoshone Paiute Tribes from membership in CBFWA effective March 31, 2013; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Shoshone Paiute Tribes will administer their BPA regional coordination funds through the Upper Snake River Tribes Foundation.
