• Discuss Results of filing for the Immediate Motion to Stay of BPA's decision to abolish the Fish Passage Center

DiscussionBrian Lipscomb and John Platt, CRITFC gave a brief review of pending litigation, whichand Status:impact the status of the Fish Passage Center contract.

A Portland federal district court judge declined to grant a request for a temporary restraining order by Public Employees for Environmental Responsibility (PEER) representing six Fish Passage Center staff. The judge specifically discussed the decision anticipated in the afternoon that day by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals on a similar request and action

There are two actions being considered by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals; a Motion to Stay Civil No. 06-70430 before the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals brought by NW Sports Fishing Industry Association, Public Employees for Environmental Responsibility, and NW Environmental Defense Center v. BPA and a Motion to Stay brought by Confederate Tribes & Bands of the Yakama Indian Nation v. BPA. The court granted an order to stay. See attached Order No. 06-71182.

The Fish Passage Center will continue operating. BPA has advised the FPC that their contract will be extended on a month by month basis, until the issues are resolved by the court.

Actions: CBFWA staff will track this issue and keep the Members informed and updated on any new developments.

The operations of Fish Passage Advisory Committee and FPAC Charter will be added to the April 18, 2006 MAG Meeting draft agenda for review and discussion.
