The NPCC is in the process of finalizing the *Draft Columbia River Basin Monitoring, Evaluation, Research, and Reporting Plan.* The Strategic Plan focuses on the policy level of the NPCC's research, monitoring, evaluation, and reporting needs, and consists of the mission, expectations, and general guidance for RM&E and reporting implemented under the NPCC's Fish and Wildlife Program. Nancy Leonard (NPCC) will provide an overview of the plan and answer any questions from the participants.

ITEM 4: Mainstem/Systemwide Categorical Review: Columbia and Snake River White Sturgeon Update

During the February 18, 2010 RFAC Meeting, participants directed Neil Ward and Christine Mallette to form an ad hoc white sturgeon workgroup to work on the RFAC's white sturgeon deliverable described in the recently approved CBFWA Work Plan. Neil and Christine will provide the NPCC's updated timeline for its Mainstem/Systemwide RM&E Categorical Review as well as an update regarding the ad hoc white sturgeon workgroup's progress. Included in the presentation will be the draft process and sideboards for convening workshops with the goal of developing monitoring frameworks and a means of transferring data so that information is readily available for inclusion in the Status of the Resources Project. Also, Neil and Christine will provide the

participants with the draft templates that may be used by the ad hoc white sturgeon workgroup to collect monitoring information and develop project justifications.

## ITEM 5: Resident Fish Losses: Development of Methodology to Assess Operational Losses

In addition, participants will discuss the metrics and ranges that the RFAC directed Neil Ward to develop relative to the operation tables that Sheri Sears provided during the February 18, 2010, RFAC Meeting.
