ITEM 2: Review of Draft Implementation Strategy Templates

Participants will review and discuss the draft implementation strategies for Zone 6 (i.e., Bonneville, The Dalles, and John Day reservoirs). The completion of these templates is important as the call for proposals, through the Categorical Review for mainstem/systemwide projects, will be June 1, 2010. A review of these products will help participants understand what information should be included in the implementation strategies that are being developed for the other white sturgeon management units.

ITEM 3: Timelines and Deliverables

Proposals for the mainstem/systemwide categorical review will be due August 2, 2010. During the workgroup's initial meeting, it was decided that the implementation strategies for all white sturgeon populations/management units should be developed concurrently and submitted as a suite of strategies for use by the project sponsors, ISRP, and NPCC. Participants will discuss and set various deadlines to ensure a suite of strategies are available by August 2.
