ITEM 5: Draft Wildlife Monitoring Implementation Strategy

Discussion:

The WAC created a writing subcommittee to begin drafting a strawman Wildlife Monitoring Implementation Strategy. As the small group began working, they quickly discovered that additional guidance is necessary from the WAC (and other regional participants). The WAC will discuss several components of creating a work plan for developing a Wildlife Monitoring Implementation Strategy (WMIS).

- Discuss MERR document and its relationship to the Wildlife Monitoring Implementation Strategy. Scott has provided a first attempt at comparing these documents (see attached outline),
- Discuss habitat cover types by species to see if we can link species to a standard protocol for habitats listed in the loss assessments (2000 Program, Table 11-4). Matt Berger has initiated an effort to matching species to habitats, but has determined this may be an enormous task. Habitat Cover Types/species (see attached draft appendix C modified Feb 2010) related to MERR (page 15)
- Tom will provide a quick review of NPCC RM&E Categorical Review timeline and which wildlife projects may be impacted by that review (see http://www.nwcouncil.org/fw/budget/2010/rmeap/timeline.pdf)
