Programmatic NEPA – the FWIP

- Fish and Wildlife Implement Plan EIS (2003), known as FWIP, covers many proposed activities
 - Incorporates by reference the Wildlife Mitigation Program EIS (1997) and Watershed Management Program EIS(1997)
- General categories of actions that can be covered by the FWIP EIS include, but are not limited to:
 - Aquatic and terrestrial habitat improvements
 - Passage barrier removal
 - Land and water right acquisition and
 - Research and monitoring efforts to evaluate the efficacy of BPA actions.
- Tiered Record of Decision for 2007-2009 Council program described validation process for specific projects/contracts.
- 10/05/2009 Supplemental Analysis of the FWIP continued the validation process for each project covered in the FWIP, including public involvement

Projects Not Covered by FWIP

- Projects that are not consistent with the PA 2002 alternative adopted in the FWIP ROD;
- Projects that meet the criteria for the Council's Step Review Process
- Projects that involve substantial modification to an ongoing fish production program (for example, expansion of the program to include a new species)
- Projects with complicating factors such as:
 - controversy over effects on resources,
 - special regulatory requirements (federal, state or local),
 - the participation of other federal agencies (where environmental review methodologies may differ),
 - unprecedented actions (with accompanying uncertainty in impacts), or
 - extraordinary environmental circumstances.

Land Purchase

(Conservation Easement: Restricts Activities)

Until Management Plan Completed, Activities Supporting Maintenance of Existing Condition Only Allowed

Post Land Purchase Scenarios

- Scenario 1 No change to land use, basic maintenance only – possible that no Land Management Plan needed
- Scenario 2 Proposed restoration or changes to land use - Management Plan needed (see next slide)
- Scenario 3 Significant change to property use not covered in FWIP (e.g. build hatchery), or significant scientific controversy – Need SA, EA, EIS, or other more intensive NEPA. Public involvement would be tied to the NEPA process. Management Plan required.
