Logistics:

I have rented a 12 passenger van which will hold most of you. I will pick you up at the Best Western Motel at 7:30 am July 26. There will be some of you that will not fit in this van, so if I can identify another person who can drive 4-6 people that would be great. I would really like to not have a large convoy of rigs, the first site is in a residential neighborhood and parking is limited. I realize some of you may be coming from Corvallis; I figured you would meet us at the site separately. Again, please try and condense yourselves as much as possible. I know you are all professionals, but there is poison oak at these sites, snakes, bugs, and it will probably be hot (who knows the way the weather has been!).

The directions: <u>http://www.mapquest.com/?version=1.0&hk=4-EA3b1XK9</u> these directions are to the first site and then to the second site. The first site is South Eugene Hills. I have included maps of this site and the second site so you can check it our beforehand. Our host at this site will be Ed Alverson from the Nature Conservancy. Staff from the City of Eugene may also join us. This site one of many proposed sites that will eventually link to form a greenbelt or corridor from Fern Ridge Reservoir to Mt. Pisgah. Discussion topics: creating access for wildlife and humans; wildlife connectivity, wildlife and interactions with powerlines; restoration opportunities; and "the big picture", etc.

We will then drive to the second site (Willamette Confluence) and have lunch. More details on entrance: the entrance road will be on your left immediately after a green house at 33995 Seavey Loop Rd. The driveway is marked with orange cones and there is a small red fire zone sign. We will meet our second hosts there, Jason Nuchols and Dan Bell from the Nature Conservancy. This site is a very large site and has many different aspects so we'll take our time and look at as many as we can. This site is what would be called a "dual credit" site meaning that it provided both fish and wildlife benefits. This site also triggers a clause in the Willamette Biological Opinion that allows BPA to take restoration credit for restoring fishery benefits to this site. Discussion topics: floodplain restoration- fighting weeds; reclaiming gravel mining sites; upland restoration of oak forests using fire, native American uses, public access, homeless and transient people issues, restoration on a grand scale, etc.

Then we will mount up and drive back to Salem where I will drop you off at the motel, return the van, and meet you at the Parking lot of the Carousel: <u>http://mapq.st/pO52Wh</u> where we will look across the Willamette Slough at a property that may be a future acquisition. Discussion topics: industrial reclamation and wildlife habitat, public access and wildlife privacy, floodplain restoration, connectivity, etc. Then we happily make our way to Venti's Café for dinner- reservation at 6:30 pm sharp. We are in the basement (trust me). Venti's is probably the best place to eat good food, they have vegetarian, vegan, and meat eater options- and they have many selections of beverages for all tastes.
